Welcome To Tonight's Game

GOOD EVENING and welcome to the Sustain Stadium here at the Gerard Buxton Sports Ground for this Wiseman Lighting Floodlit Cup First Round tie against Swindon Supermarine Development.

A warm welcome to all our visitors who have made the short journey from Swindon, we hope you enjoy your short stay with us this evening and we wish you a safe journey home.

Whilst tonight's opponents operate outside of the National League System (effectively playing at the same level as Division 1 of the Wiltshire Senior League and the Premier Division of the Swindon & District League) we should underestimate our opponents at our peril. Last season they were champions of Hellenic League Division Two South and also picked up a notable scalp in last season's cup competitions beating Calne Town 3-0 on their own ground.

My understanding is that they have some talented youngsters at their disposal and have ambitions to progress to Step 6 and made an application to join the Wiltshire Senior League in the summer but expected to go straight into the Premier Division, an option not available at the end of last season with the Hellenic Division 2's not being an official feeder league to the Wiltshire Senior League at the time. That has all changed this season and if Swindon Supermarine Development can finish in the top three of their division and no team above them applies to join the Wiltshire Senior League they would be promoted to the Premier Division and could potentially be in Division One of the UHlsport Hellenic League in two seasons. They could have joined Division One of the Wiltshire Senior League which potentially offers more opportunities for promotion but opted to stay where they were in the Hellenic League.

The Club Secretary and one of the team coaches is Nick Cope who I believe is the same Nick Cope who played for me when I

was manager out at Minety many years ago. If it is one and the same, he was a very talented footballer and will no doubt have his side playing some decent passing football.

Since the last home programme, a game which saw us achieve a fortuitous win over Hereford Pegasus, we have had three games on the road. A narrow 1-0 defeat in the local derby, in which we deserved to get something out of the game, was followed by an absolute mauling by our bogey side Corsham Town. It was unfortunate that Bailey got sent off so early on in what was actually his 100th First Team appearance but it was one of those nights to forget quickly. Credit to Sam and the lads for bouncing back so quickly on Saturday to return from Tuffley Rovers with all three points following a narrow 2-1 win. Match reports on all those four games and also all of the Dev team games since the last programme are included in tonight's edition. The Dev team have made a decent start to the season winning four and losing four of their opening eight games and travel to Salisbury Development this coming Saturday.

The Women's season is now up and running and they have made a great start to the season winning both of their opening games. A 3-0 win in the local derby league encounter with Purton was followed by a 14-0 hammering of Longwell Green in the Women's FA Cup winning £1,800 in prize money in the process. Bassett will now be away to Stockwood Wanderers in the next round. This weekend they are home to Frome Town in the League.

With this programme having to be done early due to work commitments & with no info provided by Sunday night from opponents, it is a bit of a catch up on match reports & statistics but the music quiz is back by popular demand.

Late Sykes double seals perfect start

Royal Wootton Bassett Town opened up their South West Regional Women's Football League Division One Eastern campaign with what ultimately proved to be a convincing 3-0 derby victory away at Purton.

Two late goals from Emma Sykes made sure that Bassett had to wait just 90 minutes to record their first league win - a stark contrast to last season when Bassett were forced to endure an eight month stretch before registering three points for the first time.

Only the second ever meeting between the teams despite the very short distance that separates Bassett and Purton, their opening league encounter was very much reminiscent of last season's Wiltshire County Cup quarter final tie.

Bassett triumphed 3-1 on that occasion, but left it late to seal victory. While this time keeping a clean sheet, Adam Wood's side again were made to sweat before eventually pulling clear for a deserved victory.

The visitors led at the break courtesy of a Libby Davies on the half hour mark. Beating the offside trap to race onto a Kelly Nightingale clearance, she coolly converted when through one-on-one.

Bassett were deserved leaders on the balance of play, but it wasn't an entirely comfortable lead as Clare Moreton saw a long range effort crash off the outside of the post after Davies had spurned two more excellent opportunities following defensive errors from the hosts.

It took time for the second to come. Maddy Elliott fired straight at the Purton 'keeper when well placed early in the second half

before Moreton came close to catching Millie Powell off her line from distance.

Eventually thought Bassett's second arrived as time started to wind down. Laura Jefferies, who had seen a free kick from much closer range rattle the bar, sent in a towering delivery from deep, which - catching a bobble - forced the home 'keeper to tip onto the post. And Sykes was on hand to bundle home the rebound.

While a somewhat messy goal, Bassett's third was then well-worked. Natalie Goodright picked out Sykes, who fed Davies with a first time pass. Her cross then found Lucia Green at the far post and the young debutant selflessly cut the ball back for Sykes, who produced an assured finish into the bottom corner.

Having made a winning start in the league, Bassett will now aim to make progress in the Women's FA Cup in next week's tie against Longwell Green.

Bassett hit double figures in Women's FA Cup rout

Royal Wootton Bassett Town were in dominant form as they thrashed Longwell Green 14-0 in the Women's FA Cup first qualifying round. Adam Wood's side registered eight goals in the first half before adding six after half time as they were relentless from the first minute to the last.

Facing lower level opponents from the Gloucestershire County League Division One, the gulf in class between the teams was clearly evident, with the game being more of a mismatch than a proper contest. Nevertheless, Bassett got the job done, playing some stylish football along the way, as they comfortably booked a second qualifying round date away at league rivals Stockwood Wanderers.

It didn't take long for the scoring to open, with the honours falling to Hannah Gulliver in just the fourth minute.

Libby Davies quickly made it 2-0 before Maddy Elliott got in on the act. Davies and Elliott then took it in turns to take Bassett up to 5-0, at which point Davies was withdrawn to save her legs for more tougher challenges to come.

Even with Bassett's biggest threat removed from the action, there were still three further goals to come before half time.

Emma Sykes - who netted a brace in the league opener against Purton - found the net again with an outstanding strike. What Sykes could produce, captain Laura Jefferies matched as she scored a screamer. Gulliver, adding her second, completed the scoring for the half.

Bassett could have afforded to take their foot off the gas for the second half. But that didn't happen as they continued to scorch the Longwell Green defence.

Natalie Goodright added number nine before Caily Morse quickly made it ten.

There was then a brief lull, with Bassett having to wait for number eleven. When it did arrive, Elliott completed her hat trick.

Substitute Aly Topping was on hand to make it a dozen from the penalty spot, with Jefferies adding Bassett's lucky thirteenth.

Youngster Morse - who also missed from a penalty - then finally rounded off the scoring as Bassett exceeded their previous record win in the competition by a remarkable six goals.

Tougher tests will certainly come. But - demonstrating the firepower at their disposal - Bassett made a clear show of attacking intent as they took the opening round of the Women's FA Cup by storm.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town sit top of the Hellenic League Premier Division following a 1-0 win against Hereford Pegasus - Bassett's fourth win in a row.

Connor Waldon's 17th minute goal was all that Bassett needed as they retained their 100% record with a disciplined, dogged performance.

Taking control of the ball before swivelling and firing in on the turn, Waldon's finish for his third goal of the season was an assured one.

Bassett did ride their luck somewhat again - none more so than midway through the second half when Pegasus won a penalty. However, man of the match Harry Pickering saved well from Carlos Moreira's effort from the spot.

As well as having won four from four to begin their league campaign, Sam Collier's side have conceded just once, with the result against Pegasus representing Bassett's third consecutive clean sheet.

There is still a very, very long way to go with the season still in its embryonic stages. But Collier and his team can be hugely proud of the start they have made, their early results meaning that Bassett are in the extremely unfamiliar position of the competition having to play catch up.

The next few weeks - and the next two games away at Highworth Town and Corsham Town in particular - will provide a proper test of Bassett's mettle.

Can Bassett truly be contenders? Time will tell. However there are only positives to take from the opening weeks of the season.

Royal Wootton Bassett Town lost for their first time in the Hellenic League Premier Division this season as Highworth Town edged an evenly contested derby 1-0.

Having won three of their previous four league games by just a single goal - with consecutive 1-0 victories, Sam Collier's side were served a taste of their own frustrating medicine as Josh Davies' early goal determined the outcome of a tense encounter.

While the first meeting of the two teams in five years was not necessarily a classic, the outcome hung in the balance right until the end as Bassett pushed - ultimately in vein - for a share of the spoils that would not have been undeserved.

But the woodwork - twice - and some fine goalkeeping served to keep the visitors at bay, preserving victory for Highworth.

The game's decisive moment came after 18 minutes when Josh Davis steered in first time from a Connor Mattimore cross after Sean Wood's sweeping pass out wide to Mattmore stretched the Bassett defence.

There has been little between the teams up until that point - and it remained that way throughout much of the remainder of the match.

Indeed Bassett arguably had the better of the remaining goalscoring opportunities with Matt Jones' fierce low drive and a deft Tom Moore header both hitting the post shortly before the interval before Connor Waldon saw a seemingly goalbound 89th minute effort kept out by a fine Connor Johns save.

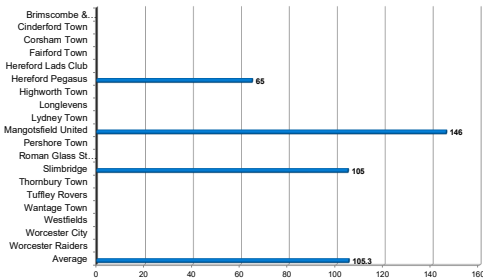

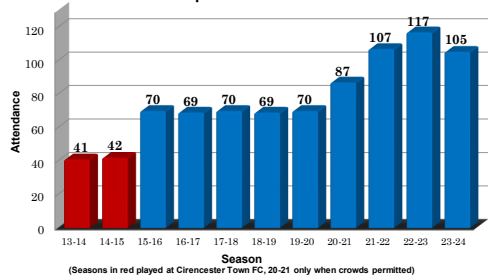

YOU can't beat a good feel-good story and Alex Fletcher's return to playing football certainly is one.

You may remember the 24-year-old was involved in a shocking incident last November while playing for the Romans against Dulwich Hamlet.

Fletcher collided with a perimeter wall during the game and had to be rushed to hospital where he spent five days in a coma.

Recovery has been long and arduous. He even had to learn how to walk again. But there were plenty of people in his corner with messages of support from across the game, including England manager Gareth Southgate and new Fulham signing Raul Jimenez, who himself suffered a serious head injury.

For us on the outside it's almost impossible to imagine what a tough period it has been for Fletcher.

We all read about the incident at the time, then heard of his recovery, but the hours away from the spotlight getting ready to come back with the support of his club must have gruelling. That's why it's so nice to see. In last week's NLP, Fletcher told Bath City reporter — and NLP Step 2 results guru — Mark Stillman about his road back to the pitch, one he was determined to make.

And he did just that a fortnight ago, coming on as an 85th-minute substitute for good friend Cody Cooke. It was a poignant moment for Fletcher, his family and all at the National League South club.

"It was a bit emotional getting back out there," said Fletcher. "I can't really describe the words to say how it felt. It was goosebumps.

"I've played the situation so many times over in my head, just being here again. For it to finally happen felt surreal.

"The reception I got from everyone in the ground, including the Hampton players, meant so much to me.

"I've got over that hurdle. It's a massive milestone reached for me and now it's about building my minutes up but not rushing it, it's important for my body that I don't do that."

Jerry Gill's side have started the season well as they look for a return to Non-League's top flight.

Fletcher, who now wears a protective headband, added: "Hopefully I can start putting myself in contention for what's been a great start to the season though it might be tough as we've got such good attacking players, which can only be good for the team."

Good for Bath but also good for Alex. It's great to see him back doing what he loves.

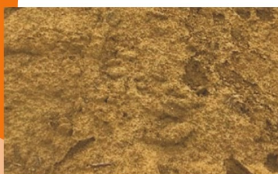

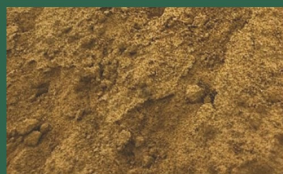
